Introduction to ICAO

The International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) grades

English Language performance on a scale of 1 to 6:

Level 1 Pre-Elementary	Level 4 Operational
Level 2 Elementary	Level 5 Extended
Level 3 Pre-Operational	Level 6 Expert

In order to conform with ICAO language proficiency requirements, Pilots, Air Traffic Controllers and all others who use English in R/T communication on international routes must be at ICAO English Language Level 4 (Operational) or above. This must be confirmed by successful completion of a licensing authority approved test.

Those who are assessed at ICAO Level 4 or 5 must be re-tested at regular intervals. Those who fail may not be licensed to operate on international routes.

ICAO Language Proficiency Requirements

Appendix A (Annex 1) of ICAO Doc 9835, which sets out the language proficiency requirements, states that pilots, air traffic controllers and aeronautical station operators shall demonstrate the ability to speak and understand the language used for radiotelephony communications to the level specified in the Appendix. The six descriptors are:

- ♦ Pronunciation
- ♦ Structure
- ♦ Vocabulary
- ♦ Fluency
- ♦ Comprehension
- ♦ Interaction

The final score for each test-taker is not the average or aggregate of the ratings in each of the six ICAO language proficiency skills but the lowest of these six ratings.





Test of English for Aeronautical Communication (TEAC)

The Test of English for Aeronautical Communication (TEAC) is a plain English for Aviation language testing system designed to assess the English language proficiency (ELP) of aviation personnel for ICAO Language Proficiency Requirements compliance.

The TEAC is a human interaction test between one candidate and one examiner and takes approximately 30 minutes. Test tasks are focused as much as possible on contexts relevant to a candidate's aviation role and experience. It is not a test of operational knowledge, but operational contexts and technical references are used to make sure that the English language proficiency being assessed is appropriate.

The test is divided in four parts:

Part 1 – Image Interview

Part 2 – Explaining an RT communication

Part 3 – Reporting Pilot/Controller Messages

Part 4 – Picture Description and Discussion

Tests are produced with aviation professional input, and performances are assessed by one aviation professional and one language expert. Candidates can choose a test version that best suits their profile, depending on their aviation role and experience. The versions available include:

The TEAC is produced, administered and managed by Lenguax which is both a UK CAA-approved ELP Testing Organisation and an approved EASA Member State Language Assessment Body.

Pilots and Air Traffic Controllers

Anglo-Continental's English for Pilots and Air Traffic Controllers Course is designed to help aviation professionals who need to meet the ICAO language proficiency requirements.

The course provides an ideal combination of general and specialised English tuition. This ensures that the trainees have the opportunity to improve their general English language skills, which is essential to support the development of the specialised aviation English required for ICAO language proficiency requirements.

General English

The general English tuition adopts an integrated skills approach. The course concentrates on structure and usage, oral communication, vocabulary development and listening and reading comprehension. This provides the trainee with an opportunity to communicate and interact with other learners in a multi-lingual environment, as well as develop their language skills in preparation for the specialised component.

Specialised Aviation English

The specialised aviation English component focuses on developing the trainee's communicative competence, with particular reference to the six ICAO language proficiency descriptors - pronunciation, structure, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension and interaction. Course participants will develop their listening skills with authentic recordings and practise using the functional language and vocabulary required in both standard and non-standard aviation situations.

The course is aimed at ICAO levels 4 and 5, and is focussed on improving the communication skills needed to achieve operational level and above.

ICAO Raters

This course is intended for teachers of aviation English and aviation professionals who are required to assess and rate the English language capabilities of pilots, air traffic controllers and other aviation professionals, according to the Language Proficiency Requirements of the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO), as set out in ICAO Document 9835. The participants' level of English language should be advanced.

We use our considerable experience in test development and language assessment to guide trainees through the course. The training concentrates on interpreting the language criteria of the ICAO Rating Scale and applying them by listening to and assessing sound files of various non-native speaker aviation professionals. It is suitable for trainees who have little or no experience in ICAO language assessment as well as raters seeking annual refresher training as set out in ICAO Document 9835.

Pre-Course Tasks

The Rater pre-course tasks are designed to focus and prepare participants on ICAO Doc. 9835 and some of the key information needed for this intensive course.

Course content

30 Lessons in a closed professional group, supplemented by guided private study.

The following areas will normally be covered:

- Evaluating and comparing different test types (e.g. for ab-initio trainees or trained professionals, direct or semi-direct, including computerised tests)
- Identifying the criteria for ICAO levels in: Listening (general comprehension, interpretation and discrimination) Speaking (accuracy, intelligibility and communicative competence)
- Defining and evaluating appropriate levels of competence in communication skills, and the 6 criteria of the ICAO Rating Scale.
- Practical exercises in rating trainees' performance at various levels of the ICAO Rating Scale, with emphasis on Levels 3 - 5.
- Identifying areas for development in failed candidates' performance, and guiding them towards improving their language proficiency.
- Blind rating assessments for standardisation purposes and to assess the course participants' level of competency using the Anglo-Continental Test of English for Aviation Personnel.

In line with ICAO language proficiency requirements for Aviation Personnel to achieve level 4 or above, Anglo-Continental provides courses for trainers and trainees to help achieve the required level of English language proficiency for this essential qualification.

Our Teaching Methodology Course for Aviation English Teachers provides vital training for English language teachers by using the latest methodology for teaching Aviation English in the context of ICAO standards, along with personal aviation language development which results from working with experienced aviation English trainers.

The objective of the training is to develop the course participants' knowledge of Aviation English and English Language teaching skills within an aviation context, including a practical review of current methodology and classroom practice. Although an aviation background is an advantage, the course is designed to enable English language teachers who have little or no prior knowledge of aviation to teach Aviation English to Aviation Personnel. As all lessons have an aviation context, every part of the course contributes towards expanding the trainees' Aviation English knowledge.

Reservation

Anglo-Continental car and coach transfers must be booked no later than 10 working days before the date of arrival, stating:

- Name
- Mobile telephone number
- Student reference number
- Date of arrival
- Time of arrival
- Flight number
- Airport of departure
- Airport of arrival
- Details of connecting flight if applicable

Payment

Payment for transfers must be made before the date of provision of the service. Any additional charges, such as delayed arrival, must be paid on the first day of school.

Arrival at the airport

When you leave the Customs Hall, look for our Representative carrying a sign with the name of the school.



Full details of the meeting point are given in the confirmation documents.

Luggage allowance - car and coach transfers

Your free allowance is one piece of luggage of a standard size and shape weighing not more than 23kg, plus one item of hand luggage of not more than 10kg.

If your luggage does not conform with the above, an additional charge may have to be made. It is important that you advise us in advance if there is excess baggage so we can make appropriate arrangements, otherwise you may find that the excess luggage cannot travel with you and there may be additional charges.

Delayed arrival - car transfers

The driver will wait for 2 hours from the advised arrival time. If you are delayed further, for whatever reason, the driver will wait for up to an additional 2 hours and you will be charged £ 60 per 30 minutes. Any additional charges must be paid on the first day of school.

Possible waiting times for coach transfers

It is our aim to transfer you to Bournemouth as soon as possible after meeting our representative. However, Anglo-Continental cannot be held responsible for delays caused by

late arrival of incoming flights, congestion at UK Border Control, hold-ups at Customs or heavy traffic on the roads or any other event.

Young Learners travelling alone

If your son/daughter is under 16 years of age and is travelling without an adult, the transfer service and check-in service will automatically be reserved and invoiced. We advise you to check with the airline for rules and regulations regarding this. You will be responsible for any unaccompanied child airline service charges. On departure, a member of our team will take your child to the check-in counter and check him/her onto the flight and accompany him/her to security.

Transfers on British public holidays

Transfers on British public holidays may have a surcharge; please contact us for a special price.

Cancellation

Notice of cancellation or change of a transfer must be received in writing by the school before 12.00 hours (British Time) on the Wednesday prior to the scheduled day of arrival or departure. If such notice is not received within the period stipulated, we incur obligations to the transport companies and therefore the full charge must be paid.

Conditions of enrolment

All enrolments are subject to these Conditions of Enrolment. They become legally binding once Anglo-Continental confirms acceptance of your enrolment. Enrolments are also subject to the age limits and arrangements published in Anglo-Continental's official publications.

By enrolling, you confirm that:

- you intend to attend and complete your course at Anglo-Continental;
- you are able to participate fully in your course;
- you will comply with all applicable UK laws during your stay; and
- you will leave the United Kingdom at the end of your studies.

Anglo-Continental reserves the right, at its discretion, to refuse or withhold confirmation of an enrolment where this is considered necessary in the interests of the student or the school, or where an incorrect declaration has been made.

Fees

Course and accommodation fees apply from **1 January to 31 December** each year. Fees for the following year are normally published during **July or August**.

All fees must be paid in full and received in Anglo-Continental's bank account **no later than four weeks before your course starts**. If full payment is not received by this deadline, Anglo-Continental reserves the right to cancel your course, accommodation and any other booked services without notice.

Course fees are calculated in complete weeks. Any

part of a week is charged as a full week.

No course, accommodation or other services will be arranged until full payment has been received.

No compensation, fee reduction, refund, credit, additional lessons or course extension will be given for:

- services or facilities included in the fees that are not used;
- arriving late, being absent or leaving your course early without formally curtailing your course;
- lessons replaced by placement testing, class allocation procedures or the sightseeing tour provided on course entry dates;
- days when the school is closed for official public holidays; or
- cashless cards or vouchers.

Any approved refund can only be made by the Agent that originally received the payment. If no agent received the payment, then any approved refund will be made by Anglo-Continental.

Anglo-Continental reserves the right to adjust fees without prior notice if statutory taxes change.

Visas

If you require a visa, it is your responsibility to:

- apply for the correct type of visa for the full duration of your course;
- check that all details on your Anglo-Continental confirmation documents are correct before submitting your visa application; and
- maintain the correct immigration status throughout your studies.

Anglo-Continental cannot accept responsibility for errors that occur during the visa application process. Failure to obtain or maintain the correct immigration status may result in your studies being terminated without refund or compensation.

School regulations

Anglo-Continental has published School Regulations to help courses operate safely and efficiently.

By enrolling, you agree to comply with:

- the School Regulations; and
- the laws of England and Wales.

For students under 18, this obligation also applies to the parent, guardian or other person arranging the enrolment.

Cancelling or change of a test

If you wish to cancel or change the date or time of a test, you must notify the school in writing at least 5 working days before the scheduled test.

If we do not receive your written notice within this period, the full test fee will remain payable.

14 day cooling off period

If you enrol online, you may cancel your enrolment within 14 days of submitting it.

If Anglo-Continental receives your written cancellation within this 14-day period, we will refund your course fees in full, less any bank charges.

Conditions of enrolment

Cancelling your course

Course bookings cannot be transferred to another person.

If you wish to cancel your course, you must notify Anglo-Continental in writing.

If you cancel more than four weeks before your course starts:

- your course fees will be refunded;
- any non-refundable deposit, bank charges and a £100 administration fee will be deducted.

If you cancel less than four weeks before your course starts:

- your course fees will be refunded;
- a £500 cancellation charge will be deducted;
- bank charges will be deducted; and
- any non-refundable costs for third-party services (such as hotel accommodation, flat rental or courier services) will also be deducted.

If you wish to postpone your course, please notify us in writing as soon as possible. An administration fee and any accommodation costs already incurred on your behalf may be charged. If the postponement of your course occurs less than four weeks before your course starts then any cancellation of the course will incur a £500 cancellation charge.

If your visa application is refused, Anglo-Continental will refund any published course fees paid in advance, less a **£100 administration fee**, provided that:

- you send us a copy of your visa refusal letter; and
- we receive it before your original course start date.

Please note that any non-refundable costs for third-party services (such as hotel accommodation, flat rental or courier services) will also be deducted.

No refund will be given if you arrive after your course has started or choose not to use any part of your course, accommodation, facilities or activities.

Curtailment of a course (Excluding courses with reduced fees)

If you shorten a course that is **more than eight weeks** long after it has started, you must give the school **four weeks' written notice**.

If you do not give enough notice, you must pay the course fees instead of notice, together with any accommodation charges due.

In all cases, a minimum of **eight weeks' course fees** is payable.

If you shorten a course of **eight weeks or less**, no refund of course fees can be given.

Students are responsible for arranging personal insurance to cover situations where they cannot attend or continue their course for medical or compassionate reasons (see **Liability and Insurance**).

Change of course (Excluding courses with reduced fees)

If, after your course has started, you wish to transfer to a course of a lower specification, you must give the school two weeks' notice.

Any change is subject to the school's approval and must take place on a scheduled entry date for the new course.

If a refund is due, it will be issued as a credit that may be used:

- towards an extension of your revised course; or

- towards another course at Anglo-Continental taken within 12 months of the end of your revised course.
- This credit cannot be transferred to another person and cannot be exchanged for cash.

Incorrect declaration

Anglo-Continental reserves the right to withdraw a student from their course if:

- an incorrect declaration has been made; or
- information about the student's ability to participate in the course has not been fully or accurately disclosed before the course starts.

If a student is withdrawn for either of these reasons, no refund will be given.

English language level

Any information provided about your English language level before your arrival is for guidance only.

Your final English language level will be determined by our entry test on your first day.

If your English level does not meet the requirements of your chosen course, you will be transferred to a more suitable course.

Accommodation

The fee for the first week of homestay accommodation includes a **non-refundable administration charge** to cover the cost of selecting, reserving and arranging your accommodation.

If you wish to change or leave your accommodation, either on its own or because you are shortening your course, you must:

- give Anglo-Continental at least **two weeks' notice** before the proposed move date; and
- receive the school's approval before making any change.

If you do not give the required notice, accommodation fees will be charged in place of notice.

A charge of **£80** applies for each request to change homestay accommodation.

Accommodation fees remain payable during any period of absence from your accommodation while your course is in progress.

If you do not arrive on the scheduled arrival date at your accommodation, Anglo-Continental reserves the right to cancel your accommodation booking. If this happens, we may not be able to arrange alternative accommodation.

Photography, video, audio recordings and written work

During your course, Anglo-Continental may take photographs, video recordings and audio recordings. These may be used in, but are not limited to:

Recordings are stored securely for a limited period and may be shared with the appropriate authorities where required by law.

CCTV is not used in areas where individuals would reasonably expect privacy.

Liability and insurance

Except where required by law, Anglo-Continental accepts no liability for any loss, damage, illness or injury to any person or property, regardless of how it is caused.

Anglo-Continental is also not responsible for:

- delays to services provided by third-party companies; or
- situations where a third-party service cannot be provided as booked.

Any complaints, claims, losses or damages relating to third-party services should be made directly to the company providing that service.

Students are responsible for arranging personal insurance to cover these risks, including:

- medical expenses; and
- being unable to attend or continue a course for medical or compassionate reasons.

If your information is held by an Anglo-Continental Agent in your home country, it will be processed in accordance with that Agent's own data protection policy and the laws of that country.

Validity of conditions

They are governed by the **laws of England and Wales**, and the English language version is legally binding in all cases.

UK visa requirements
